



Invitation to Confession


Christ has entered heaven itself, there to appear before God on our behalf. Let us therefore draw near in full assurance of faith, and confess our sins to the God of grace.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.' So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles. (Acts 1.15-17, 21.26)

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

NICENE CREED





All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere, mighty Creator, ever-living God.


We give you thanks and praise for our Saviour Jesus Christ' who by the power of your Spirit was born of Mary and lived as one of us.



After supper, he took the cup, and again giving you thanks he gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Drink from this, all of you.


This is my blood of the new covenant shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.



Come let us take this holy sacrament of the body and blood of Christ in remembrance that he died for us, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.


