INTRODUCTION AND WELCOME

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called 'Gaudete Sunday' (lit. 'rejoice Sunday'). We light the rose candle on the Advent Wreath and we wear rose vestments as a sign of the coming joy. This joy runs through our readings. Our focus continues on those who prepare the way for the coming of Christ: today is John the Baptist. After the service we will also be interring the ashes of Ann Brady in the memorial garden and Fr Jim is joining us for the service. Let us worship God.

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. In that light we confess our sins:


Heavenly Father,

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke:

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Therefore, bear fruits worthy of repentance, and do not begin to say to yourselves, we have Abraham as our ancestor, for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.' And the crowds asked him, "What, then, should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none, and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.' As the people were filled with expectation and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water, but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into

his granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So with many other exhortations he proclaimed the good news to the people.
